Jill Fahy, M.A., CCC-SLP, is the director of STEP (Students with Autism Transitional Education Program) and professor in the Department of Communication Disorders and Sciences at Eastern Illinois University. Ms. Fahy is a nationally known speaker on the evaluation and treatment of executive dysfunction. She is the author of *The Source: Development of Executive Functions, 2nd Edition* (2017), and has published articles on the role of SLPs in evaluating and treating executive dysfunction, and the relationship of language and reasoning in executive functions. Although her primary role is developing and coordinating services for STEP, Ms. Fahy continues to teach graduate courses in aphasia, cognitive-communication and executive functions, and grand rounds in medical speech-language pathology. Ms. Fahy's clinical work over the years has focused on developmental and acquired aspects of language and executive functions, particularly for adolescents and young adults seeking diagnostic insight and therapeutic support for transitional needs beyond secondary education. Prior to coming to EIU, Ms. Fahy worked for several years as a medical speech-language pathologist, specializing in brain injury rehabilitation.
